Through challenging course work and integrated field experiences, students master a set of flexible and highly marketable professional skills — including quantitative and qualitative research, critical thinking, team collaboration, leadership, social awareness, and communication. Our graduates go on to pursue meaningful careers in social work, teaching, public policy, law, education administration, urban planning, community development, marketing, management, applied research, and advanced social science research.

Study Abroad

To broaden their perspective and deepen their social and cultural intelligence, Sociology students are encouraged to study abroad. TCNJ's Center for Global Engagement offers over 100 study abroad sites to choose from worldwide.

Mentored Student Research

Sociology students are encouraged to carry out research with faculty mentors. Each year, the department's faculty offer research courses to give students the opportunity to work closely with them on cutting-edge research projects. Students may also choose to carry out independent research with faculty support. Some students choose to carry out a two-semester, research-based Senior Thesis as their culminating major Capstone project.





Internships

Most Sociology students complete at least one internship — and getting hired after graduation is a frequent occurrence. Students can receive academic credit for internships at almost any type of organization related to their studies.
