Programs of Study

The World Languages and Cultures program offers:

- A major in world languages and linguistics focused on the science of languages with a concentration in Arabic, French, Italian, Japanese, or Spanish
- A major in Spanish focused on bilingual and multicultural studies of the Hispanic world through language, literature, history, and the arts
- Minors in eight different languages Arabic, Chinese, French, German Studies, Italian, Japanese, Linguistics, Russian Studies, and Spanish

- Study abroad opportunities at more than 100 locations through TCNJ's Center for Global Engagement

Heritage Spanish-Speaker Programming

Spanish-speaking students can start their major or minor with a course designed specifically for students raised speaking Spanish. This learning environment, with an emphasis on the Hispanic experience in the U.S., is tailored for students who want to develop fluency and poise, strengthen their writing skills, and raise their proficiency toward professional levels.

Study Abroad Opportunities

Gaining global experience and perspective through immersion in other languages and cultures is integral to our program. Students may choose a credit-bearing program offered by TCNJ or one of many third-party programs provided through TCNJ's Center for Global Engagement. TCNJ also offers unique study opportunities at Universidad Adolfo Ibanez in Vina del Mar, Chile, as well as faculty-led programs in and around Madrid, Spain at Universidad de Alcalá de Henares and Universidad Complutense de Madrid.

For additional experience and exposure in languages and cultures of interest, there are many student-led organizations on campus to get involved with. The WLC department supports and participates in: Chinese Students Association, French Club, German Club, Italian Club, Japanese Student Association, and Spanish Club.
